Genre	Description
Classical	A forceful rhythm and the use of instruments like trumpets, a string bass and a saxophone.
Hip Hop/rap	Traditional and generally rural music that are passed down from generation to generation.
Pop	Combination of pop, gospel, blues, jazz with a strong back beat.
Blues	Imitation of folk style of the Southern U.S.
Jazz	Music involving electronic processing.
Gospel	Fast speaking rather than actual singing.
Country	Strong beat and rock instruments, i.e. electric guitar, etc.
Rhythm & Blues	More formal and different from pop or folk music.
Electronics	Short songs with a strong beat which is very popular.
Folk	Related to Christianity.
Rock	Rock music which is intense and powerful.
Heavy Metal	Expressions of feelings rather than stories. The emotion is generally one of sadness.
