

## SELF-INTRODUCTION

## 1. Introducing our nationality

Give each student an electronic copy of handout 1, print it or display it on a projector. Go over each country and its nationality. Let the students repeat after you. Listen to their pronunciation and correct it where necessary.

2. Get 2 students and let them stand in front of the class. Find out what their real names are and use that. Point at the nationality when you introduce yourself and them.

Point at the female and pretend you are her. Say:

'I am [NAME]. I am [NATIONALITY].' Point at the male. 'He is [NAME]. He is [NATIONALITY].'

Point at the male and pretend you are him. Say:

'I am [NAME]. I am [NATIONALITY].' Point at the female. 'She is [NAME]. She is [NATIONALITY].'

NOW point at yourself and say:

'I am teacher [NAME]. I am [NATIONALITY]. He is [NAME]. He is [NATIONALITY]. She is [NAME]. She is [NATIONALITY].'

3. Point at yourself and say:

'I am teacher [NAME]. I am [NATIONALITY].'

Point at the student to your left and say:

'He is [NAME]. He is [NATIONALITY].'

'She is [NAME]. She is [NATIONALITY].'

Tell the students to repeat this by pointing at themselves and then the person to their left.

4. Introduce the following conversation with an added question. Nod if the nationality is correct, shake your head when the nationality is incorrect:

'Hi, I'm [NAME]. I'm [NATIONALITY].' 'Are you [NATIONALITY]?' 'Yes, I am.' 'No, I'm not! I'm [NATIONALITY].' Handout 1 - countries and their nationalities. Pay attention to pronunciation,
