### Activity 1: "The Borrowing Game" (Group Game)

One student thinks of an item.



Others ask: "Can I borrow your ... ?"



The student decides yes or no and gives a funny reason.

### Activity 2: Would You Rather...? (Discussion)

1. Would you rather **lend** your phone to a friend or **borrow** a phone from a stranger?
2. Would you rather **borrow** money from family or from a friend?
3. Would you rather lend your car for one day or borrow someone's old car?

### Activity 3: The Arrow Race

1. Work with a partner. Look at the two hands below.
2. Take turns reading a sentence. Your partner must immediately point to the **LEFT**  **(Borrow)** or the **RIGHT**  **(Lend)**.
3. Go as fast as you can!

### Sentences to read to your partner:

- "Can I **borrow** your pencil?"                      "I can **lend** you my umbrella."
- "My neighbor always **lends** tools."              "We need to **borrow** some sugar."

### Activity 3: Quick Self-Check
