TEACHER-STUDENT WORKSHEET. ELICIT ANSWERS AND WRITE THEM ON THE BOARD

1. There Are - Countable nouns.

Question: 'How many apples are in the

tree?'

Answer: 'There are six apples in the tree.'

Alternate the questions, i.e.

Question: 'Are there six chairs in the

picture?'

Answer: 'No, there are three chairs in the picture.'

2. Some and Any

As a general rule, we use 'some' for affirmative sentences, and 'any' for questions or negative sentences. Usually, both 'some' and 'any' can only be used with countable plural nouns or uncountable nouns.

Question: 'Do we have any milk in the fridge?'

Answer: 'No, we don't have any.' or

'Yes, we have some.'

Students practice the above conversations with the teacher.

3. Little, a lot

Draw a wine glass on the board with a little wine in the bottom.

Question: 'How much wine is there in this glass?'

Answer: 'There is a little wine in the glass.'

Draw another glass that is full.

Question: 'How much water is there in the

glass?'

Answer: 'There is a lot of water in the glass.'

Tell the students, that we can leave the 'a' out if you so wish.

Example:

Question: 'How much water is in the dam?'

Answer: 'There's little water in the dam.'

'There's lots of water in the dam.'

Question: 'How much water is in the dam?

Answer: 'There's a little water in the dam.'

'There's a lot of water in the dam.'

Practice the above conversations.
