ADVERBS

What is an adverb?

Adverbs describe a verb, adjective, or another adverb. It tells us how, where, when, how much, and with what frequency something is done. *These worksheets will look at a few adverbs of manner and adverbs of frequency*.

1. Adverbs of manner:

| softly | loudly | slowly | quickly |
|--------|--------|---------|---------|
| high | low | quietly | hard |

Example Sentences:

She speaks softly.The children screamed loudly for their team.Grandpa walks slowly.You need to run quickly.Please jump high.Please crawl low.You need to move quietly.I study hard.

2. Adverbs of frequency:

These words tell us how frequently we do things or how frequently things happen.

| Adverb | Percentage (How often) | Example Sentence |
|-------------|---------------------------|--|
| Always | 100% | I always drink a glass of milk for breakfast. |
| Usually | 80% | I usually go to bed at 10 p.m. |
| Often | 70% | My sister often takes our dog for a walk. |
| Sometimes | 40% | Peter sometimes helps me with my homework. |
| Hardly ever | 20% | I hardly ever watch scary movies. |
| Never | 0% | I never eat junk food because it is bad for my health. |
