



WATCHING TV BASICS

Lesson Overview

Level: A1

Main Grammar: Simple Present – I watch / He watches, I like / I don't like

Key Vocabulary: TV, watch TV, remote, channel, cartoon, news, football, movie, series/show

Light Extra: always, usually, sometimes, never (with habits)

Lesson Aims

- Talk about TV habits and routines
- Say what you like / don't like
- Use basic adverbs of frequency

Time: 45–60 minutes

Materials: Flashcards (PDF 2), Practice sheets (PDF 3), Speaking (PDF 4), Homework (PDF 5)

Teacher Tips

- Model every sentence clearly.
- Use lots of gestures, pictures, and repetition.
- Accept short answers and pointing at first.
- Praise every effort!

Warm-up (10–15 minutes)

1. Picture Discussion

Show a TV picture or first flashcards.

Ask: "Do you have a TV? What do you watch?" (thumbs up/down)

2. Like / Don't Like Game

Hold up flashcards.

Ask: "Do you like cartoons?"

Students answer with thumbs and try: "Yes, I like cartoons." / "No, I don't like news."

3. Quick Adverbs

Show: always 😊 usually 😊 sometimes 😊 never

Model: "I always watch TV." / "I sometimes watch cartoons."

Ask 2–3 students.

How to Continue

Challenges & Quick Fixes

Shy students → Start with pointing.

Mixed levels → Stronger students help others.
