The Simple Past Tense

When do we use the Simple Past Tense?

- 1. The event is in the past.
- 2. The event is completely finished.
- 3. We say or understand the time and/or place of the event. In general, if we say the past time or place of the event, we must use the Simple Past Tense. We cannot use the Present Perfect.

Simple Past

Regular verbs

The past verb version is formed by adding -ed or -d to the end of the root verb. The past participle form of the verb is the same as its past form.

Irregular verbs

These are verbs that don't take on the regular -d, -ed to its root to form its past tense or its past participle.
