The Simple Future Tense

When do we use the Simple Future Tense?

We use the Simple Future tense when there is no plan or decision before we speak. We make the decision spontaneously when we speak. We often use the words "to think" before 'will'. We also use the Simple Future tense when we make a prediction about something in the future. Again, no firm plan. We can also use the Simple Future tense when "be" is the main verb and even if there is a plan or decision before we speak. We use 'will not' or 'won't' for a negative question or statement.

The Simple Future Tense

I will go home after class.I think I'll visit my grandma tomorrow.I will not attend class today.I won't go to London for the holiday.
