LIKE WANT NEED

Lesson Objectives

Students learn the difference between like, want and need and practice using it.

Target Language

She *likes* to eat snacks. They *like* to eat pancakes.

I *like* to eat toast. You *like* to play football.

We **want** to eat popcorn. He **wants** to dance.

You *want* to eat. It *wants* to play.

He **needs** to relax. We **need** to study.

I **need** to eat vegetables. It **needs** to sleep outside.

Need - Do you really *need* the things you say you need? *Needs* are things that we *need* to survive. We *need* air, food, and water. *Needs* can also be called '*musts*' because they are things we *must* have.

Want - **Want** is not a **need**, but it is also important in our lives; for example "I **want** my own room".

Like - *Like* is less important than Need or Want. *Like* is sometimes just like a nice dream; "I would *like* to win the lottery!"
