



THIS THAT THESE THOSE

Lesson Objectives

Students learn and practice how to use *this*, *that*, *these*, and *those* in a sentence and ask a question.

Target Language

That (This/That) red car over there is the nicest of them all.

These (These/Those) books right here are mine.

Did you say **these** (this/these) cookies are delicious?

Which of **these** (that/these) ties should I buy?

Etc.

Vocabulary

this, that, these, or those

basket, boxes, socks, mug

knives and forks

trolley (a cart), cupcakes or muffins

milk, fruit juice, or yogurt

cutting board

earrings, necklace

etc.

This, *that*, *these*, and *those* are demonstrative determiners. We use *this*, *that*, *these*, and *those* to point to people and things. *This* and *that* are singular. *These* and *those* are plural. We use *this* [singular] and *these* [plural] to talk about things close to us, and *that* [singular] and *those* [plural] to talk about things at some distance away from us. We use them as determiners and pronouns and sometimes use them on their own.
