



BODY PARTS

1. Teacher Says - A Gesture Activity

All the students stand up and have some space around them. The teacher says: 'Teacher says touch your eye', then the students need to touch their eyes. 'Teacher says touch your mouth' and the students touch their mouths. Explain that when you do NOT say 'Teacher says', but only 'touch your mouth', then the students should NOT react. If they react, they are out of the game.

Start this game by speaking slowly, but later bring up the heat and speak much faster to confuse them. This is a fun activity!

If there is time, you can ask a student or two to call out the actions!

2. Heads, shoulders, knees, and toes - **click** on the picture below to gain access to this famous children's song! Let the students sing along and do the gestures! This is an energetic activity and full of fun!
