

CAN CAN'T

What can you do?

Ask a few students in a round-robin manner to answer using complete sentences.

Examples: I can ride a bicycle.

I can swim.

I can speak English.
I can make a sandwich.

We use "CAN" to express ability - to say "I can do something."

I can = I know how to do something. / I know that something is possible for me.

Write this on the board:

Ask students to answer using complete sentences.

Can you spell your name?
OR
Can you give me your address?
OR
Can you tell me your phone number/email?

We also use **CAN** when you ask someone to do things.

Can you ride a bicycle? Yes, I can.
Can you swim? Yes, I can.
Can you speak English? Yes, I can.

Sometimes we **CAN NOT** do something for example: I **can not** speak Spanish.

We have positive sentences - [I can speak Spanish].

We also have negative sentences - [I can not, or can't, speak Spanish].
