

# IN ON AT

### Prepositions of Place IN ON AT

Do you know how to use these prepositions to talk about a place?

Here are some examples:

Put the milk in the fridge.

My notebook is on the desk.

We meet at the football field after school

#### **Round-Robin Questions**

Students to answer using complete sentences:

Where is your English book? **On** the desk.

Where do you sleep? **In** my bed. **In** my room.

Where is your pencil case? On the desk OR In my bag.

Where is your mother? At my house OR At work.

Notice: When we say where things are, the preposition goes before the noun!

## We use IN when we talk about something BIG like:

He lives in (a country).

The best weather is *in* (a province)

I want to stay *in* (a city)

There are many fish in (the sea, a dam, a river, a lake)

My dad lives in (the forest, countryside, mountains)

I left my phone *in* (a car, bus, train, taxi, plane)

My bag is in (my room, the kitchen, the classroom, the library, etc.)

#### Where is your best friend?

He/she is in \_\_\_\_\_. (A country / province / city / room, etc.)

#### We use ON when we talk about ON something (a surface).

The clock is on the wall.

The cats play **on** the floor.

My pen is on my desk.

The gym is **on** the 2nd floor.

The library is on Main Road.

She is selling sandwiches on the street.

#### Where is your father's office?

His office is on the 15th floor.

#### We use AT when we talk about a place.

Wait for me at your house.

I live at 23 Pine Street.

I'm at school.

We can meet at the coffee shop.

My dad is **at** work.

I am sitting at my desk.

### Where do you hang out when you have free time?

At the mall.

#### **Prepositions of Time IN ON AT**

We also use these prepositions to talk about time.

Here are some examples:

We can meet at 5 PM.

We have a meeting on Fridays.

I do my homework *in* the afternoon.

#### **Round-Robin Questions**

Students to answer using complete sentences:

What time do you have dinner? We have dinner at 6.00 PM. When can you sleep late?

I sleep late on Saturdays.

When do you do your homework? *I do my homework in the afternoon.* 

When can we go swimming? We can go in the spring.

When do you have lunch?

I have lunch at break time.

# We use *IN* when we talk about a time during the day, longer times like a month, a season, or a year like:

I do my homework in (what part of the day? *In* the afternoon, *in* the evening)

My birthday is in (a month).

We play cricket / soccer in (a season).

We moved to America *in* (a year).

Our Christmas party is in (a month).

We go skiing in (a month or a season).

#### When is your birthday?

My birthday is *in* \_\_\_\_\_.

# We use ON when we talk about days and dates. On Fridays, we don't have homework. It's her birthday on 3 May. We are having a lunch on Christmas Day.

She was born on August 31st.

# When is your birthday?

My birthday is **on** \_\_\_\_\_.

### We use AT when we talk about a time or a time period.

He goes home at lunchtime.

I get up at 5.00 AM.

We will have lunch at noon.

I have no money at the moment.

I always go home at sunset.

We all get together at dinnertime.

### When do you have lunch?

I have lunch at \_\_\_\_\_.

It rains a lot \_\_\_\_\_ spring.
