



Group Practice (Three students per group)

Student 1: can, might, should

There are 3 modal verbs allocated to each student (see page 2).

Student 1 uses his/her first modal verb “can” and chooses any problem for student 2 to make a suggestion.

Student 2: could, must, will

After student 2 gives his/her suggestion, he/she uses his/her first modal verb and continues with the same problem or chooses a different problem for student 3 to make a suggestion.

Student 3: may, shall, would

As soon as student 3 is finished, he/she chooses one of his/her modal verbs and continues with the same problem or chooses another problem for student 1 to talk about.

Continue in a round-robin manner.

Use as many of the “problems” as you can with the same modal verb, if possible.
