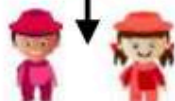

## EXTENDED FAMILY

Sandy: Tell me about yourself.

Sandy: Wow, that's lovely! How old are they?  
Mary: They are still little. 2, 5, and 7 years.

### Conversation 3 - Practice the conversation in pairs.

Nancy: Hello Steven.  
Steven: Hi Nancy.  
Nancy: Steven, tell me about your family.  
Steven: I come from a small family, but my extended family is large *[big]*.  
Nancy: Tell me about them.  
Steven: I have one married brother, ten cousins, and two nephews.  
Nancy: That sounds good. Do they all live in your hometown?  
Steven: Yes, every single one! My grandparents live with us in the same house.

### Conversation 4
