Teacher Student Activity

1. Does anyone know what the “Definition of Fairtrade” is? (*Definition: trade between companies in developed countries and producers in developing countries in which fair prices are paid to the producers*)
2. How does buying fair products help developing countries?
3. How does buying fair products help the producers?
4. Can you think of any everyday products that might be Fairtrade certified? (Coffee, chocolate, bananas, flowers, etc.)
5. Imagine you're a coffee farmer. How would your life be different if you sold your beans through Fairtrade compared to a regular company?
6. Fairtrade is often a bit more expensive. Why do you think some people might be willing to pay more for these products?
7. Besides price, what are some other things that are important to consider when buying clothes or food? (Quality, origin, environmental impact, etc.)
8. Is fair trade good or bad?
9. Do you think it's fair that some companies make a lot of money while the people who grow the ingredients might earn very little? Why or why not?
10. In your opinion, is Fairtrade fair?
11. In your opinion, what's the best way to raise awareness about Fairtrade? (Posters, social media campaigns, talking to friends, etc.)
12. Can you think of any ways that your school or community could support Fairtrade? (Buying Fairtrade products at a school store, organizing a Fairtrade bake sale, etc.)
13. Have you ever bought or tried a Fairtrade product?
14. Have you ever seen the Fairtrade logo on a product? What does it look like? (Ask students to describe the logo or draw it)
15. Do you ever look for Fairtrade products?
16. Why do you think Fairtrade products are more expensive?
17. Why do people buy Fairtrade?
18. Why do you think Fairtrade is especially important for developing countries?
