Types of News

Politics, sports, entertainment, weather, business, health, etc.

News Sources

Newspapers, websites, TV channels, radio stations, and social media platforms.

News Verbs

Reporting, broadcasting, consuming, announcing, covering, following.

News Adjectives

Breaking, sensational, unbiased, exclusive, reliable, etc.

News Events and Phenomena

Summit, scandal, natural disaster, protest, investigation.

Headline Language

Breaking news, developing story, exclusive interview, latest update, live coverage.

Idioms and Phrases

Off the record, hot off the press, front-page news, etc. **Bad news travels fast** - bad news travels faster than good news **Bearer of bad news** - someone who delivers bad news **Break the news** - to tell (someone) bad news. **Breaking news** - news of an event that just happened or just begun **Fake news** - false or misleading information **Front-page news** - a very important or interesting story **That's news to me** - something one is hearing for the first time
