Negative Forms

Cannot

Can't

The negative form of *can* is *cannot* or *can't*.

The negative form of *could* is *could not* or *couldn't*.

To form the negative of **be able to**, you either put **not** or another negative word in front of **able**, or you use the expression **be unable to**.

Teenagers *cannot* get married.

My sister *can't* swim very well.

I could not find my keys this morning.

I couldn't understand the rules.

I am *not able to* help you.

I was *unable to* afford the trip.
