Who's the Oldest/Youngest?

1. Ask students: Who is the oldest/youngest in your family?
2. Examples:
 - My grandfather is the oldest in our family.
 - My little brother is the youngest in our family.
3. Practice with different superlatives:
 - the biggest
 - the shortest
 - the tallest
