Comparing Family and Friends Warm-Up Questions

- 1. Do you have any brothers, sisters, or cousins?
- 2. Who is older or younger than you in your family?

Make Your Own Sentences

Use the word "younger" or "older" to describe your family or friends.

Example: My sister is younger than me.

Practice Time!

Choose random students and ask them to complete the sentences with "younger" or "older":

1.	I am	than my brother/sister.
2.	My brother/sister is _	than me.
3.	My father is	than my mother.
4.	Mv cat is	than my dog.

Round-Robin Practice

Comparing Family Members:

- 1. Choose a student to start.
- 2. Make two sentences using "younger" or "older" about your family.
- 3. Example: My mother is older than my brother, and my brother is younger than my sister.

Rotate around the class.

Moving to Superlatives!

Who's the Oldest/Youngest?

- 1. Ask students: Who is the oldest/youngest in your family?
- 2. Examples:
 - My grandfather is the oldest in our family.
 - My little brother is the youngest in our family.
- 3. Practice with different superlatives:
 - the biggest
 - the shortest
 - the tallest

Tips for Teachers

- Encourage students to use complete sentences.
- Provide feedback and correction.
- Keep it fun and engaging!
