1. What's Different?

Work in pairs, facing each other.

Student A closes their eyes while **Student B** changes 3 things about their appearance (removes glasses, rolls up sleeves, etc.)

Student A opens their eyes and makes sentences like "You are not wearing your glasses" or "You have your sleeves rolled up."

Take turns to make sentences and change things.
