A1-A2: Adverbs of Degree

Level: A1-A2

Topic: Adverbs of Degree (very, really, quite, too, so, a bit, extremely)

Skills: Vocabulary, Grammar, Speaking, Listening

Time: 60–90 minutes

Central Material: Large park scene image (PDF 2)

Objectives (Can-Do Statements)

- I can use adverbs of degree to make sentences stronger or softer.
- I can describe intensity of feelings and situations (very happy, too hot, a bit tired...).
- I can use “too” correctly for problems.
- I can talk about how I feel and ask others.

◆ Lead-in Activity (Teacher-Student – 5–8 minutes)

1. How do you feel today?
2. What words do you know to make an adjective stronger? (e.g. happy → very happy)
3. When was the last time you felt *too* tired or *extremely* happy?
4. Do you prefer *very* hot weather or *quite* cold weather? Why?
5. Before we look at the picture: What different feelings do people usually have in a hot park on a sunny day?

Vocabulary Elicitation

Write on the board: very, really, quite, too, so, a bit, extremely.

Ask students for examples.

→ Show the big central image.

Tip: Accept short answers at A1. Encourage longer sentences at A2.
