A. Introduction to "This, That, These, Those"

What are Demonstrative Pronouns?

We use **this, that, these,** and **those** to talk about objects and their location. These words tell us:

- If something is near or far
- · If we are talking about one thing or more than one

Understanding the Difference

Singular Plural

Near → This (one object)
Far → That (one object)
Far → Those (more than one)

Real-Life Examples

- Imagine you're holding a book. You say: "This book is interesting."
- Imagine there is a book on a faraway shelf. You say: "That book looks old."
- Imagine you have several books in your hands. You say: "These books are heavy!"
- Imagine there are many books far away. You say: "Those books belong to the library."
