



TRAIN JOURNEY

A Train Journey - Word Library

Here are important words that will help you understand "A Train Journey" and talk about trains!

1. Train - Pronunciation: TRAYN
 - **Meaning:** A long vehicle that carries people or goods on railway tracks.
 - **Example:** We took a fast **train** to the city.
2. Journey - Pronunciation: JER-nee
 - **Meaning:** A trip or travel from one place to another.
 - **Example:** Our train **journey** was very comfortable.
3. Station - Pronunciation: STAY-shun
 - **Meaning:** A building where trains stop for people to get on or off.
 - **Example:** We met at the train **station** at 8 o'clock.
4. Platform - Pronunciation: PLAT-form
 - **Meaning:** The raised area next to the train tracks where people wait for the train.
 - **Example:** Please wait behind the yellow line on the **platform**.
5. Tracks (Railway Tracks) - Pronunciation: TRAKS (RAYL-way TRAKS)
 - **Meaning:** The metal lines on the ground that a train runs on.
 - **Example:** The train moves on the **tracks**.
6. Ticket - Pronunciation: TIK-et
 - **Meaning:** A piece of paper or card that shows you have paid to travel.
 - **Example:** Remember to buy your **ticket** before you get on the train.
7. Passenger - Pronunciation: PAS-sen-ger
 - **Meaning:** A person who is traveling on a train, bus, plane, etc.
 - **Example:** Many **passengers** were reading books.
8. Luggage - Pronunciation: LUG-ij
 - **Meaning:** Bags and suitcases that travelers carry on a trip.
 - **Example:** Please put your **luggage** above your seat.
9. Compartment - Pronunciation: kum-PART-ment
 - **Meaning:** A small, separate room inside a train for a few passengers.
 - **Example:** We had a quiet **compartment** with a big window.
10. Conductor - Pronunciation: kun-DUK-ter
 - **Meaning:** The person who checks tickets and helps passengers on a train.
 - **Example:** The **conductor** announced the next stop.
11. Arrive - Pronunciation: uh-REYEV
 - **Meaning:** To reach a place at the end of a journey.
 - **Example:** The train will **arrive** at the station soon.
12. Depart - Pronunciation: dee-PART
 - **Meaning:** To leave a place to start a journey.
 - **Example:** Our train will **depart** in five minutes.
13. View - Pronunciation: VYOO
 - **Meaning:** What you can see from a particular place, especially beautiful scenery.
 - **Example:** The **view** from the train window was amazing.
