



GOING ON A CRUISE

A. Buffet Breakfast: Choose Your Plate!

Imagine you are on a cruise ship enjoying a buffet breakfast! You will work in groups called "blocks." One student will be the "server" who offers food. Other students will be "guests" with different personalities.

The Buffet Breakfast Menu

Here are some foods you can offer and ask for

Scrambled Eggs	Honey	Croissant
Boiled Eggs	Maple Syrup	Croissant - Chocolate
Fried Eggs	Chocolate Sauce	Muffin
Bacon	Strawberry Yogurt	Donut
Sausages	Fresh Fruit Salad	Coffee - Black
Mini Steak	Plain Yogurt	Coffee - With Milk
Chicken Schnitzel	Granola	Tea
Tuna	Toast - Whole Wheat	Herbal Tea
Fish Fillets	Toast - White	Orange Juice
Pancakes	Jam	Milk
Waffles	Butter	Chocolate Milk

Your Block's Character

Your teacher will tell you which "Block" you are. Read your block's description carefully!

Block A: The Easy Eaters

You are polite and happy to eat anything. You like simple, common breakfast foods. You say "please" and "thank you."

- **What you say:** "Can I have some eggs, please?" "Thank you very much!" "Yes, that sounds good."

Block B: The Picky Eaters

You are very careful about food. You might not like many things, or you ask for specific types of food (e.g., "no sugar," "only fruit"). You might refuse some foods politely.

- **What you say:** "No thank you, I don't eat meat." "Do you have any sugar-free jam?" "Just a little fruit, please, no syrup."

Block C: The Complainers

You are not happy and find problems with everything. You might complain about the food, the portions, or even the server. You are a little bit rude.

- **What you say:** "Is that all you have?" "This coffee is cold!" "I wanted more bacon!" "Why don't you have [something not on the menu]?"

Block D: The Hungry & Sweet Lovers

You are very hungry and love sweet foods! You want large portions and many sweet things like pancakes, waffles, and syrup. You are happy and friendly.

- **What you say:** "Wow, everything looks delicious!" "Can I have a lot of pancakes and syrup, please?" "And some muffins, too!" "More coffee, please!"

How to Play:

1. Your teacher will choose one student to be the **Server**.
2. The **Server** will go to each block and offer food from "The Buffet Breakfast Menu."
 - o **Server can say:** "Good morning! What would you like for breakfast?" or "Would you like some eggs?"
3. The **Guests** in each block will respond according to their character's personality.
4. After a few minutes, a new student can become the Server.

Language Points:

- **Requests:** "Can I have...?", "Could I get...?", "I'd like...", "Do you have...?"
- **Offers:** "Would you like...?", "Can I get you...?", "How about...?"
- **Politeness:** "Please," "Thank you," "No, thank you."
- **Preferences:** "I like...", "I don't like...", "I prefer..."
- **Quantifiers:** "A little," "a lot of," "some," "any."
- **Adjectives:** "Cold," "delicious," "sweet," "fresh."

Teacher's Key

Buffet Breakfast: Choose Your Plate!

Setup:

1. **Divide the class into four "Blocks."** Assign each block (or small group within a block) a character role: Block A, B, C, or D. Ensure students understand their assigned personality. You might even give them 1-2 minutes to discuss as a group how they will act.
2. **Explain the activity:** Go over the "Buffet Breakfast Menu" and the "How to Play" instructions. Emphasize that the goal is to *act like their character* and use the provided phrases or similar ones.
3. **Choose the first Server:** This student will walk around to each block.

Running the Activity:

1. The **Server** approaches Block A: "Good morning! What would you like for breakfast?" or "Would you like some eggs?"
2. Block A (Easy Eaters) responds politely.
3. The **Server** moves to Block B (Picky Eaters), then Block C (Complainers), and finally Block D (Hungry & Sweet Lovers), interacting with each group according to their character.
4. Encourage the Server to offer different items from the menu, and for guests to ask for specific things.
5. **Rotate the Server:** After 5-7 minutes (or when the server has visited all blocks), choose a new student to be the server. You can also have students switch blocks/characters for another round to practice different roles.

Language Points to Observe:

- **Requests:** "Can I have...?", "Could I get...?", "I'd like...", "Do you have...?"
- **Offers:** "Would you like...?", "Can I get you...?", "How about...?"
- **Politeness:** "Please," "Thank you," "No, thank you."
- **Preferences:** "I like...", "I don't like...", "I prefer..."
- **Quantifiers:** "A little," "a lot of," "some," "any."
- **Adjectives:** "Cold," "delicious," "sweet," "fresh."

Possible Follow-up Discussion:

- Which block was the easiest/most difficult to serve? Why?
- Which block would you rather sit with at breakfast?
- What was your favorite food on the menu?
- What other foods would you like to see at a cruise buffet?
