Verb Tense Adventure!

Let's have fun with verbs from our story about Lila, Sam, and Tara! We'll practice **Simple Present**, **Simple Past**, and **Simple Future** tenses. These help us talk about what happens now, what happened before, and what will happen later. Get ready for some popcorn-popping activities!

1. Simple Present Tense

We use this for things that happen now or all the time.

Example from the story: Lila says the cinema has the best popcorn.

Pattern: I/You/We/They + verb | He/She + verb + s

Example: I like movies. She likes popcorn.

Activity A: Fill in the Blanks (Simple Present)

2. Simple Past Tense

We use this for things that happened before.

Example from the story: Lila *clapped* when they made a plan.

Pattern: I/You/He/She/We/They + verb + ed (or irregular verb)

Example: We watched a movie. She ate popcorn.

Activity B: Change to Simple Past

Change these Simple Present sentences to Simple Past. Watch out for irregular verbs!

- I like a comedy movie. → I _____ a comedy movie.
- They eat popcorn. → They _____ popcorn.
- Sam wants to stay home. → Sam _____ to stay home.
- We watch a movie. \rightarrow We _____ a movie.

3. Simple Future Tense

We use this for things that will happen later. Example from the story: They *will meet* at Sam's house. **Pattern:** I/You/He/She/We/They + will + verb **Example:** I *will watch* a movie tomorrow.

Popcorn Tense Party Game!

Let's Play: Popcorn Tense Toss!

This is a fun game to practice all three tenses. You'll need a small ball (or pretend popcorn!).

How to Play:

- Sit in a circle with your class. The teacher says a verb (like "watch," "eat," or "like").
- Toss the "popcorn" (ball) to a student. They say the verb in one tense (Present, Past, or Future).

Example: Teacher says "watch." Student says, "I watched a movie!"

- The student tosses the popcorn to another friend, who uses a different tense. **Example**: "I will watch a movie!"
- Keep going until everyone gets a turn. If you drop the popcorn, say a silly sentence like, "I will eat popcorn forever!"

Bonus Activity: My Movie Night Story

Write 3 sentences about your own movie night using each tense. Draw a picture to go with it!

- **Simple Present:** (Example: I like funny movies.)
- Simple Past: (Example: I watched a movie last night.)
- **Simple Future:** (Example: I will eat popcorn tomorrow.)

Answers

Activity A: Simple Present

- Sam wants to save money for movie night.
- We eat popcorn when we watch movies.
- Tara *likes* funny movies.
- They *watch* movies at the cinema every weekend.

Activity B: Simple Past

- I *liked* a comedy movie.
- They ate popcorn.
- Sam wanted to stay home.
- We *watched* a movie.

Activity C: Simple Future (Example answers)

- I *will watch* a movie tonight.
- We *will eat* popcorn at home.
- She will go to the cinema.
- They will make popcorn with butter.
