Grammar Fun: Nouns, Verbs, and Adjectives!

Part 1: Nouns - People, Places, Things, and Ideas!

What are Nouns? Nouns are naming words! They name a **person** (like *doctor*, *Betty*), a **place** (like *pharmacy*, *university*), a **thing** (like *medicine*, *headache*, *oranges*), or an **idea** (like *flu*, *health*, *sleep*).

Activity A: Find the Nouns! Read each sentence about Betty and her doctor's visit. **Underline all the nouns** you can find!

- 2. She had a headache and all her muscles hurt.
- 3. Dr. Snow prescribed some medicine from the pharmacy.

Part 2: Verbs - Action Words!

What are Verbs? Verbs are **action words**! They tell us what someone or something *does* (like *call, hurt, prescribe, drink, study*). Verbs can also show a state of being (like *is, feel*).

Part 3: Adjectives - Describing Words!

What are Adjectives? Adjectives are describing words! They tell us more about nouns. They answer questions like "What kind?" or "How many?" (like terrible, tired, important, healthy).
