



## POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

### What You Will Do

You will learn possessive adjectives: my, your, his, her, its, our, their  
These words show who owns something.

### Part A: What Is a Possessive Adjective?

Look at these examples:

|--------------------------------|------------------|
| 1. I have a book.              | It is my book.   |
| 2. You have a pen.             | It is your pen.  |
| 3. Pedro has a bike.           | It is his bike.  |
| 4. Maria has a phone.          | It is her phone. |
| 5. The dog has a toy.          | It is its toy.   |
| 6. Pedro and I have a house.   | It is our house. |
| 7. Pedro and Maria have a car. | It is their car. |

We use possessive adjectives before a noun to show ownership.
