



## WORD CLASS & SENTENCE PARTS

### Activity A – What Is an Object?

An object is the person or thing that gets the action. There are three kinds of objects:

Type	What It Does	Example
Direct Object	Receives the action directly	She reads a book.
Indirect Object	Receives something from the action	He gave me a pen.
Object of a Preposition	Comes after a preposition	We sat on the bench.
