| 5. The soup smells delicious.      | Complement = delicious                     |

### Activity B – Word Class Challenge

Since students choose their own words, just a reminder:

Noun = person/place/thing

Verb = action/state

Adjective = describes a noun

Adverb = describes a verb/adjective
