



### PDF 2: Fun Speaking & Activities

#### Warm-up Speaking

##### Talk with a partner:

“What is something interesting about you that you can share when meeting new people?”

#### A: Icebreaker Speed Dating (10–12 min)

**Setup:** Students sit in two lines facing each other.

Change partners every 1–2 minutes.

**Task:** Practice starting conversations and “breaking the ice.”

Use natural small talk and try to include the idiom “break the ice” when possible.

##### How to Play:

When the teacher says “Change!”, students move to the next partner and start a new conversation. Try to keep talking without long silences.

#### B: Create Your Own Icebreaker (10–15 min)

**Task:** In small groups (3–4 students), create **5 good icebreaker questions or openers** that you could use when meeting new people.

##### Example Icebreakers:

- “Hi! I’m new here. What’s your favorite subject this year?”
- “By the way, do you have any hobbies you really enjoy?”

After the group finishes, they share their best 2–3 icebreakers with the class.

The class can vote on the most useful or funniest ones.

#### Pronunciation & Fluency Tip

Practice saying “break the ice” naturally:

“Let me break the ice...” or “That really helped break the ice!”

#### Extra Fun Task

Choose one icebreaker from your group and use it with a new partner for a 2-minute conversation.

##### Useful Icebreaker Starters:

- Hi, I’m [Name]. Nice to meet you!
- So, what do you like to do in your free time?
- By the way, how’s the weather treating you today?
- Anyway, have you seen any good movies lately?

##### Categories to think about:

- Easy / Safe topics (weather, school, hobbies)
- Fun topics (favorite food, music, weekend plans)
- Light personal topics (favorite subject, dream job)
