Part 1: Grammar Box – “He’s Always Doing That!”

We use present continuous + always to describe repeated annoying actions.

Examples:

- He’s always touching my stuff.
- He’s always copying what I say.
- He’s always knocking on my door.

Practice: Write 3 sentences about annoying habits using “always + -ing.”
