



PDF 4 – Fun Activities (25-35 minutes)

Activity 1: Phone Loss Role Play (Pairs – 8 minutes)

Student A: You are **Priya** – very dramatic and panicked because you lost your phone again.

Student B: You are the **helpful friend** trying to calm her down and give advice.

Useful language:

- “Oh no, not again!”
- “I’m in big trouble!”
- “Stay calm!”
- “Retrace your steps.”

Activity 2: “Find My Phone” Survey (Walk around – 8 minutes)

Ask 4 different classmates:

1. Where do you usually lose things (phone, keys, wallet)?
2. Do you use “Find My Phone” or similar?
3. What is your funniest “lost item” story?

Activity 3: Good Advice vs Funny Bad Advice (Groups of 3-4)

Give **one good** and **one funny bad** advice for these situations:

- “I lose my phone every week!”
- “I left my phone in the school toilet.”
- “My phone fell in the toilet!”

Activity 4: Chain Story – The Lost Phone Adventure (Groups of 4)

One student starts the story:

“I lost my phone at the café...”

Each person adds **one sentence** to continue the silly story.

(Example: “...and then my cat took it...”, “...and I found it in the fridge!”)

The group with the funniest story wins!

Activity 5: My Anti-Loss Plan (Quick individual → pair)

Write **3 things** you will do to stop losing your phone.

You can use ideas from Grok or create your own.

Then share with your partner.
