Advice for Big Siblings

Part 1: Partner Speaking – “Advice Swap”

In pairs, take turns giving advice to each other about annoying siblings.

Example Dialogue:

A: My brother always copies me.

B: You should say something silly so he gets bored.

A: Good idea! Maybe I’ll sing a weird song.
