Activity 1 – Meme Bingo (10–12 minutes)

Easy mingling activity. Walk around and ask: “What is something your parents don’t understand?”

Instructions:

1. Use the Blank Bingo Cards on page 2 **OR** draw a 3x3 grid on your paper.
2. Walk around the classroom and talk to **different classmates**.
3. Ask: “What is something your parents don’t understand?”
4. Listen to their answers and write it in **one** of the boxes.
5. When you have **any 3 answers in a row** (horizontal, vertical, or diagonal), shout “**BINGO!**” and you win!
6. You don’t need the full grid filled. Just three in a line is enough to win.

- New slang
- Apps
- Funny videos
