Grammar Box – Talking About Cleaning Habits

We use frequency adverbs to say how often we do something.

They usually go before the main verb or after “be.”

Adverb	Meaning
always	100% of the time
usually	80–90%
often	60–70%
sometimes	30–50%
rarely	10–20%
never	0%

Examples:

I **always** clean my desk on Sundays.
My brother **never** helps with laundry.
The room is **usually** messy after school.
