



THE REVOLVING DOOR

Part 1: Short Writing Task – My Awkward Moment

Write a short paragraph (4–6 sentences) about a time you felt confused, embarrassed, or surprised in public. Use past simple and at least two feeling adjectives.

Helpful Words:

embarrassed, proud, confused, nervous, relieved, surprised, happy

Example: Last year, I walked into the wrong classroom. Everyone stared at me. I felt embarrassed and confused. I said “Good morning!” and left quickly. Later, I laughed about it with my friend.

Example Response

“I pressed the door for the haunted museum. I entered and saw floating candles and a talking skeleton. I should have brought garlic. If I stayed longer, I might have joined the ghost tour. The door was designed to trap tourists – I escaped just in time.”
