pilot – mechanic – flight attendant – journalist

Odd one out: journalist

Reason: The others all work in aviation/on planes (pilot flies, mechanic fixes planes, flight attendant serves on flights). Journalist works in media/news.

photographer – graphic designer – chef – architect

Odd one out: chef

Reason: The others are creative/design jobs that often use computers or drawing (photographer takes pictures, graphic designer makes digital art, architect designs buildings). Chef works with food/cooking.

software developer – interpreter – journalist – writer

Odd one out: interpreter (or software developer – both acceptable)

Reason options:

- Interpreter translates spoken language (the others mainly write: software developer codes, journalist/writer write articles/stories).
- OR Software developer works with computers/technology (the others work with languages/words).

mechanic – electrician – plumber – teacher

Odd one out: teacher

Reason: The others are manual/trade jobs that fix things (mechanic fixes cars, electrician fixes wiring, plumber fixes pipes). Teacher works in education/with students.

barista – waiter – chef – programmer

Odd one out: programmer

Reason: The others work in restaurants/food service (barista makes coffee, waiter serves tables, chef cooks). Programmer works with computers/coding.
