Frequency	Adverb	Example Sentence
100%	always	I always brush my teeth in the morning.
90%	usually	She usually walks to school.
70%	often	We often eat dinner together.
50%	sometimes	He sometimes watches TV after work.
30%	occasionally	They occasionally go out on Fridays.
10%	rarely	I rarely eat fast food.
0%	never	She never drinks coffee.
