Teacher Notes

Aim

Learn room names (bedroom, kitchen, etc.) + furniture vocabulary (“bed,” “sofa,” “table”).

Practice sentences: “This is my bedroom.” / “There is a sofa in the living room.”

How to Use

- Warm-up oral questions
- Show pictures (point/say chorally)
- Match/label activities
- Pair descriptions and short dialogues

Tips

- Articles often missing → students say “bed” instead of “a bed” → remind “a bed,” “the sofa.”
- “There is/There are” confusion → repeat slowly with gestures: “There is a...”
- Plurals are rare in some languages → students say “one chair” not “chairs” → model plurals.

Common Errors to Watch For

- “This my bedroom” → correct: “This is my bedroom.”
- “There sofa in living room” → correct: “There is a sofa in the living room.”
- “Two chair” → correct: “Two chairs.”

Student Output Goals

- Say 3–5 sentences with “This is...” and “There is/are...”
- Ask and answer 2 questions about rooms/furniture
- Use plurals correctly at least once

Warm-up / Quick Quiz (Oral – 5–10 min)

Ask, model, point to real classroom items or mime.

1. Where do you sleep? (Bedroom!)
2. What room has a fridge? (Kitchen!)
3. Where do you watch TV? (Living room!)
4. Where do you take a bath? (Bathroom!)
5. What furniture is for sitting? (Sofa/chair!)
6. Quick: Point to a table in the picture!

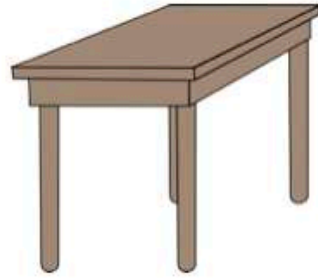

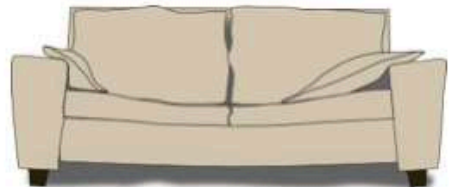
