### Picnic Day

#### 1. Warm-up (3–5 minutes)

Look at the picture.

- What do you see in the picture?
- Do you like picnics? Why?
- What food do you like to take on a picnic?



#### 2. The Story

It is a beautiful sunny Saturday. The sky is bright blue and there is not a cloud in sight. Anna and her family decide to have a picnic in the big park near their house.

They arrive at the park and find a nice spot under a big old tree. Dad lays out their favorite colorful blanket on the grass. Mom opens the big picnic basket and everyone gets excited. There are cheese sandwiches, fresh fruit, homemade cookies, and cold lemonade.

4. What do the children do after eating?
5. What does Dad do after lunch?
6. What does the dog do?
7. Why is Picnic Day special?

### 5. Fun Speaking / Personalization

Choose **one** (or more if time allows):

#### Option A – Plan Your Picnic (Creative)

Imagine you are going on a picnic. Tell your partner:

- Where do you go?
- Who do you go with?
- What food do you take?
- What do you do there?

#### Option B – Picture Description Game

Look at the picture again. Describe **3 things** you see to your partner. Your partner guesses what you are describing.

#### Option C – Role Play

Student A = Parent

Student B = Child

Talk about the picnic: “What do you want to eat?” / “Can we play ball now?”
