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Activity A: Controlled Practice - The Teacher's Shop (8 – 10 minutes)

Asking and answering about quantity using *much, many, some, any, a few, and a little*.

How to do this activity:

1. The teacher is the "Shopkeeper" of the market stall. The students are the "Customers."
2. The teacher shows the big market stall image to the class.
3. The teacher asks questions to different students using specific quantifiers to test their grammar and scanning skills.
4. Students must look at the image and answer using the correct structure.

Teacher Prompts:

"Welcome to Talkmor Market! Look at my stall.

Bruno, ask me if I have any milk."

Student: "Do you have any milk?"

→ Teacher: "Yes, I have some milk."

"Lucas, do I have much flour on the table?"

Student: "No, you don't have much flour on the table, it is under the table!"
