



## FOOD & DRINK

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### Activity A: Find Someone Who... (Mingle – 8–10 minutes)

Walk around and ask your classmates. Write their names.

1. Find someone who likes pizza. \_\_\_\_\_ likes pizza.
2. Find someone who doesn't like fish. \_\_\_\_\_ doesn't like fish.
3. Find someone who likes spicy food. \_\_\_\_\_ likes spicy food.
4. Find someone who likes ice cream. \_\_\_\_\_ likes ice cream.
5. Find someone who drinks coffee in the morning. \_\_\_\_\_ drinks coffee in the morning.

### Activity B: Role-Play Cards (Practice in pairs)

#### Role-Play 1 – At the Café / Restaurant

Student A: You are the customer.

Student B: You are the waiter / waitress.

#### Useful Language

- Can I have ..., please?
- I'd like ...
- This is delicious!
- Can I have the bill, please?

Role-Play 2 – At the Market	Role-Play 3 - Talking about Food Preferences
Student A: You are a customer. Student B: You are the market seller.	Student A & B: You are new friends having lunch together.

### Activity C: Ordering Food

**Student A:** You are the customer. Ask for these items and complete your order.

You want:

- A pizza
- Some water
- One ice cream

**Student B:** You are the waiter. Look at the menu and answer your partner's questions.

### Activity D: Group Debate: True or False Food Critics

Work in pairs or a group. Look at the "Food & Drink" market scene together. Take turns reading the statements below aloud. **Discuss** and decide if each statement is **True** or **False**.

If a statement is **False**, you must work together to speak the correct sentence aloud!

1. The man sitting at the front-left table says, "*Can I have a coffee, please?*"
2. On the bottom-left table where the pizza is placed, a small menu sign says "PIZZA \$12".
3. There are no sweet items like cakes, bread, or pastries anywhere to be seen in the picture.
4. The girl standing by the fruit stand on the right says, "*I'd like some water.*"

### Activity E: Find Your Dinner Partner!

Walk around the room and ask your classmates about their food tastes. Do not write anything down—just speak! Your goal is to find a classmate who matches each description below. When you find them, say "**Bon appétit!**" and move to a new classmate.



**Speaking Tip:** Remember to ask polite, complete questions like:

*"Do you like pizza?" or "What do you like to eat when it is cold outside?"*

1. Find a classmate who loves to drink hot coffee on a cold autumn morning.  
Ask: "Do you drink coffee or tea when the weather gets chilly?"
2. Find a classmate who **dislikes fish or seafood**, just like the man at the table.  
Ask: "Do you like fish, or do you prefer meat and chicken?"
3. Find a classmate who prefers sweet things (like gelato or cake) over savory things (like burgers or pizza).  
Ask: "If you could only eat ice cream or pizza for the rest of your life, which one do you choose?"
4. Find a classmate who knows how to cook a traditional food from their country.  
Ask: "Can you cook? What is a delicious meal you can make at home?"
5. Find a classmate who prefers drinking plain water instead of sweet soda with dinner.  
Ask: "What do you usually order to drink at a restaurant?"

### Activity F: What's on Your Plate?

Work in pairs or small groups.

- Turn to your partner. Ask them these questions:

What is your favorite food for dinner?'

What do you drink when you are very thirsty?

Do you prefer coffee or tea in the morning?

What is one food you absolutely do not like?

#### Teacher Notes

- Encourage polite language ("please", "thank you").
- Monitor "some/any" and correct use of like/likes.
- Role-plays can be performed in front of the class if time allows.
