### Lesson Overview

This lesson helps students talk about movies, cinema, genres, and watching habits using simple everyday English. Students learn useful vocabulary for talking about films, expressing opinions, buying tickets, and discussing what they like to watch.

**Level:** A1-A2

**Lesson Time:** 45-60 minutes

### Warm-Up Discussion

**Ask students:**

- Do you like watching movies?
- How often do you watch movies?
- Do you prefer watching at home or at the cinema?
- What was the last movie you watched?
- What is your favorite movie genre?

#### Target Language

- What kind of movies do you like?
- I like action / comedy / horror...
- It's very exciting / funny / scary.
- How much is the ticket?
- Let's watch a movie.
- I prefer watching at home.
- The acting is good / bad.

| <p>The teacher says an amount of money. Students name a movie or something related they can "buy" or do with that money.</p> <p><b>Examples</b></p> <p>\$5 – A cinema ticket (cheap one)<br/>                     – Popcorn and a drink</p> <p>\$10 – Two cinema tickets<br/>                     – A movie rental online</p> <p>\$20 – A cinema ticket + snacks<br/>                     – A streaming subscription for one month</p> <p>\$50 – Many cinema visits<br/>                     – A new movie on Blu-ray</p> <p>Encourage students to give different answers and explain their choices.</p> | <p>Name a movie genre or a movie title, and the students must quickly shout out if it is "Action!", "Comedy!", "Horror!", "Cartoon!", or "Drama!"</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Teacher's Genre List</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Spider-Man (Action!)</li> <li>• Minions (Cartoon!)</li> <li>• A horror movie (Horror!)</li> <li>• Frozen (Cartoon!)</li> <li>• A romantic comedy (Comedy!)</li> <li>• Jurassic Park (Action!)</li> <li>• The Lion King (Cartoon / Drama!)</li> </ul> |

**Teacher Tips**

- Bring pictures of movie posters or popcorn if possible.
- Encourage students to ask and answer: "What kind of movies do you like?" and "I like...".
- Keep the discussion practical by focusing on movies students actually watch.
- Movies and cinema are topics almost everyone can talk about, making this one of the most enjoyable lessons for natural conversation.
