



Teacher's Guide

Lesson Overview

This lesson helps students talk about where they live — their hometown, city, or town. They will learn useful vocabulary for places in a town, describe their area, and talk about what they like or dislike about it. Very practical and personal topic that works well for all ages.

Main Goals:

- Build vocabulary related to towns and cities
- Practice describing location and features
- Develop speaking confidence about personal information
- Compare different hometowns

Skills: Vocabulary, Speaking, Listening, Writing

Time: 60–90 minutes (full pack)

Warm-up Activities (10–15 minutes)

Activity 1: Quick Questions

Ask the class:

- Where are you from?
- Do you live in a city, town, or village?
- What is the name of your hometown?

Activity 2: Show & Tell

Ask students to show a photo (on phone) or draw a very quick sketch of their hometown and say **one thing** they like about it.

Activity 3: Class Survey

How many students live in:

- A big city?
- A small town?
- A village?
- By the sea / in the mountains?

Teacher Tips

- Encourage students to bring photos of their hometown if possible.
- Be sensitive — some students may prefer not to share personal details.
- This topic pairs well with maps, Google Earth, or pictures of different cities.
