Lesson Objective

Students will learn about Diwali, one of the most important festivals in India and many other parts of the world.

Students will practice:

- speaking
- simple descriptions
- sharing ideas
- learning about culture and traditions

Warm-Up Questions

Ask students:

1. Do you like festivals?
2. What is your favorite celebration?
3. Do you enjoy fireworks?
4. Do you decorate your home for special occasions?
5. Do you like receiving gifts?

Stand Up If...

Students stand up if:

- you like festivals
- you enjoy fireworks
- you like colorful decorations
- you enjoy family celebrations
- you would like to visit India

Introduce the Topic

Tell students:

Diwali is known as the Festival of Lights. People celebrate with lamps, decorations, food, family gatherings, and fireworks.

Ask: Does this festival sound interesting?

- What part sounds most exciting?
- Would you like to celebrate Diwali?

Class Poll

Raise your hand.

Would you like to celebrate Diwali?

- Yes Maybe No

Ask several students to explain their answers.

Teacher Tip

Allow students to describe the picture before teaching new vocabulary.

Encourage curiosity and discussion.
