Duration: 45–60 minutes

Teacher Overview

This practical lesson teaches essential vocabulary and phrases for ordering food and drinks, interacting with waiters, and talking about meals in a restaurant setting. Strong focus on real-life speaking.

Going to a restaurant is a very common real-life situation. Students feel confident quickly because they can use the language immediately. Great for role-plays and very motivating.

Warm-up (10 minutes)

1. Lead-in Questions

- Do you like eating at restaurants?
- What is your favorite food?
- What do you usually order to drink?

2. Vocabulary Brainstorm

Elicit words: waiter, menu, table, order, bill, delicious, etc.

- #### 3. Useful Phrases (write on board)
- Can I have the menu, please?
 - I'd like... / I'll have...
 - The bill, please.
 - Is it spicy / vegetarian?

Teaching Tips:

- Focus on polite language ("please", "thank you", "I'd like...").
- Use real or printed menus if possible.
- Role-plays are the most valuable part of this lesson.

Transition: "Now let's look at the pictures and vocabulary on the worksheet."
