### Teacher Overview

This practical lesson introduces imperatives (positive and negative) for giving instructions, commands, advice, and directions. Focus is on real-life usage rather than heavy grammar.

Imperatives are extremely useful in everyday English (classroom, directions, recipes, signs, safety). Students can start using them immediately.

## Warm-up (8–10 minutes)

### 1. Lead-in

Give simple commands to students:

- Stand up.
- Sit down.
- Open your book.
- Don't talk.
- Listen, please.

### 2. Quick Presentation

On the board:

Positive: Come here. / Sit down. / Be quiet.

Negative: Don't run. / Don't touch. / Don't be late.

### 3. Classroom Practice

Give a few commands and have students follow / repeat.

#### Teaching Tips:

- Keep it fun and active. Use gestures and real actions.
- Focus on polite intonation ("Please sit down").
- Common uses: classroom language, directions, recipes, warnings.

**Transition:** "Now let's look at more examples on the worksheet."
