



## SOME AND ANY

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### A1-A2 Level

**Duration: 40–55 minutes**

### Teacher Overview

This lesson teaches the correct use of some and any with countable and uncountable nouns in positive sentences, negative sentences, and questions. Students also practice offering, asking for things, and talking about food/shopping.

### Why teachers love this lesson:

Some and any are very common but often confusing for beginners. This lesson gives clear rules, lots of practice, and real-life situations (shopping, kitchen, parties) that students can use immediately.

### Warm-up (8–10 minutes)

#### 1. Lead-in Questions

- Do you have any brothers or sisters?
- Do you have some money in your pocket?
- Is there any milk in your fridge?

#### 2. Quick Presentation

On the board:

- Some → positive sentences (I have some water. There are some apples.)
- Any → negative sentences & questions (I don't have any milk. Do you have any questions?)

#### 3. Quick Drill

Teacher says a sentence, students repeat with correct some/any:

- I have \_\_\_ apples.
- I don't have \_\_\_ bread.
- Do you have \_\_\_ water?

### Teaching Tips:

- Teach together with countable (apples, books) and uncountable (water, rice, money).
- Focus on real-life contexts: shopping, fridge, parties.
- "Some" can also be used in questions when offering (Would you like some tea?)

**Transition:** "Great! Now let's practice on the worksheet."
