3. Create Your Own Fortune Cookie

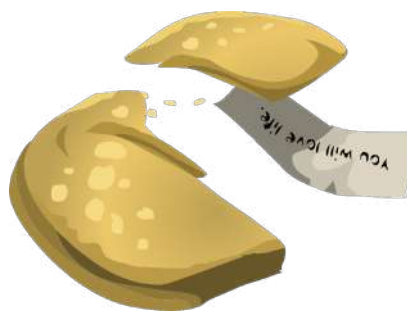
Write three fortunes.
